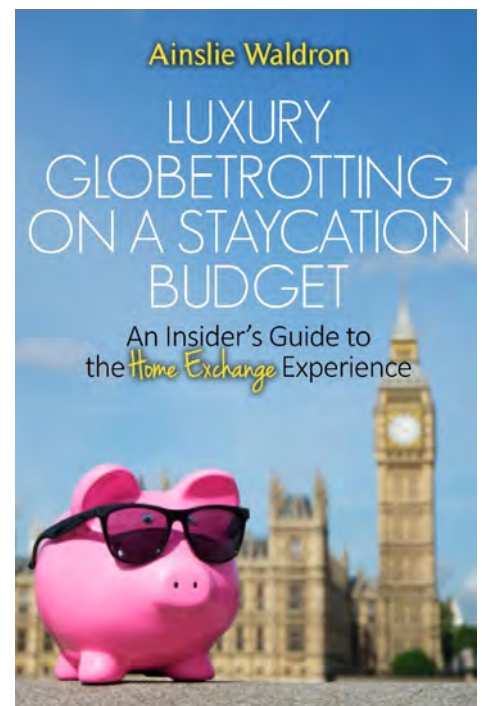
Come "Home"
